OR securing to Lessors and Land Owners their just Rights, and to prevent Frauds frequently com-Former Provi-mitted by Tenants, Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice stons with regard and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, to Rents, and by the Authority of the same, That in case any Tenant or Tenants for any Term of Life, Lives or 8 Ann. c. 10.
