


COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

NOTICE

Pursuant to Section 412 of the District of Columbia Self-Government and Governmental Reorganization Act, PL 93-198, ( the Act ), the Council of the District of Columbia adopted Bill No. 1-209 on first and second readings January 27, 1976 and February 24, 1976, respectively. Following the signature of the Mayor on March 19, 1976, this legislation was assigned Act No. 1-95, published in the March 31, 1976, edition of the D.C. Register, and transmitted to both Houses of Congress for a 30-day review, in accordance with Section 602 (c) (1) of the Act.

The Council of the District of Columbia hereby gives notice that the 30-day Congressional review period has expired and, therefore, cites the following legislation as D.C. Law 1-64, effective May 26, 1976.

D.C. LAW 1-64

In the Council of the District of Columbia

May 26, 1976

To implement the District of Columbia flood insurance program.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA,  
That this act may be cited as the "District of Columbia  
Applications Insurance Implementation act".

Sec. 2. The Mayor shall review all building permit applications for new construction or substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a location that has flood hazard, the proposed new construction of substantial improvement (including prefabricated homes) must (i) be designed (or modified) and anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure, (ii) use construction materials and utility

equipment that are resistant to flood damage, and (iii) use construction methods and practices that will minimize flood damage.

Sec. 3. The Mayor shall review subdivision proposals and other proposed new developments to assure that (i) all such proposals are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage, (ii) all public utilities and facilities, such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems are located, elevated, and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage, and (iii) adequate drainage is provided so as to reduce exposure to flood hazards.

Sec. 4. The Mayor shall require new or replacement water systems and sanitary sewage systems to be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters, and require on-site waste disposal systems to be located so as to avoid impairment of them or contamination from them during flooding.

Sec. 5. The Mayor shall review each permit application for any excavation, grading, fill, or construction to

determine whether the proposed site and improvements will be reasonably safe from mudslides. If a proposed site and improvements are in a location that may have mudslide hazards, a further review shall be made by persons qualified in geology and soils engineering; and the proposed new construction, substantial improvement, or grading must (i) be adequately protected against mudslide damage and (ii) not aggravate the existing hazard.

Sec. 6. The Mayor shall submit an annual report before April 1, of each year to the Council to advise the public of progress made under the National Flood Control Program.

Sec. 7. This act shall become law according to the provisions of section 602(c) of the District of Columbia Self-Government and Governmental Reorganization Act and shall be deemed to have become effective on the last day that the emergency act of the Council act No. 1-60 is in effect.
