D.C. LAW 4-115

"District of Columbia Protective Services Police Identification Act of 1982".

Pursuant to Section 412 of the District of Columbia Self-Government and Governmental Reorganization Act, P. L. 93-198, "the Act", the Council of the District of Columbia adopted Bill No. 4-379 on first and second readings, March 23, 1982 and April 6, 1982, respectively. Following the signature of the Mayor on April 12, 1982, this legislation was assigned Act No. 4-178, published in the April 23, 1982 edition of the D.C. Register, (Vol. 29 page 1701) and transmitted to Congress on April 20, 1982 for a 30-day review, in accordance with Section 602 (c)(1) of the Act.

The Council of the District of Columbia hereby gives notice that the 30-day Congressional Review Period has expired, and therefore, cites this enactment as D.C. Law 4-115, effective June 4, 1982.

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

APR 12 1982

To amend the Manual of the Metropolitan Police Department of the District of Columbia to provide for special designation of police officers under the control of the Department of General Services, and to authorize the Fire Chief to provide a clothing allowance for Fire Department members assigned to perform duties in plain clothes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "District of Columbia Protective Services Police Identification Act of 1982".

Sec. 2. Section 11.13 of the Manual of the Metropolitan Police Department of the District of Columbia, effective January 14, 1972 (Reg. 72-2; DCMR) is amended as follows:

(a) Immediately following the phrase "top of the half-circle" strike the period and add the following proviso to read as follows:

" , Provided, Further, that special police officers under the control of the Department of General Services may wear a distinctive 4 3/4" x 3 3/4" blue and gold patch carrying the words 'DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA PROTECTIVE SERVICES'. "; and

(b) Immediately following the phrase "thereon is


prohibited" strike the period and add the following proviso to read as follows:-


", except that the sergeants, lieutenants, captains, and the chief of the District of Columbia Protective Services may wear gold buttons."

Sec. 3. Section 1(b) of An Act Granting relief to the Metropolitan police and to the officials and members of the fire department of the District of Columbia, approved August 29, 1972 (86 Stat. 639; D.C. Code, sec. 4-128(b)) is amended by inserting immediately following the phrase "Metropolitan Police Force," the phrase "the Fire Chief of the District of Columbia Fire Department,".

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect after a thirty (30)-day period of Congressional review following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council of the District of Columbia to override the veto) as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Self-Government and Governmental Reorganization Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Code, sec. 1-233(c)(1)).
