CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS MERITORIOUS SERVICE RECOGNITION AMENDMENT ACT OF 1984

To amend An Act To provide recognition for meritorious service by members of the police and fire departments of the District of Columbia for the purposes of officially citing officers of the District of Columbia Department of Corrections for outstanding acts in the line of duty; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Correctional Officers Meritorious Service Recognition Amendment Act of 1984".

Sec. 2. An Act To provide recognition for meritorious service by members of the police and fire departments of the District of Columbia, approved March 4, 1929 (45 Stat. 1556; D.C. Code, sec. 4-701 et seq.), is amended as follows:

Pursuant to Section 412 of the District of Columbia Self-Government and Governmental Reorganization Act, P. L. 93-198, "the Act", the Council of the District of Columbia adopted Bill No. 5-342 on first and second readings, April 10, 1984 and April 30, 1984, respectively. Following the signature of the Mayor on May 9, 1984, this legislation was assigned Act No. 5-135, published in the May 25, 1984 edition of the D.C. Register, (Vol. 31 page 2549) and transmitted to Congress May 15, 1984 for a 30-day review, in accordance with Section 602 (c)(1) of the Act.
